

NZBIO 2010 Ross Clark Distinguished Biotechnologist of the Year Award



Each year NZBIO recognises two New Zealand scientists for their outstanding work in biotechnology. Biotechnology being defined as the application of scientific and engineering principles to the processing of material by biological agents and the processing of biological materials to improve the quality of life.

The NZBIO 2010 Ross Clark Distinguished Biotechnologist of the Year Award is presented to a leader in their field whose utilization of biotechnology during their career has contributed significantly to improving the quality of life.

Guidelines and Eligibility Criteria

Eligibility

- A biotechnologist is defined as anyone practising the following OECD definition of biotechnology, i.e. *"The application of science and technology to living organisms as well as parts, products and models thereof, to alter living or non-living materials for the production of knowledge, goods and services."*
- Candidates can be historical (deceased) or contemporary.
- Candidates will normally be a New Zealander, i.e. have New Zealand citizenship or be a New Zealand resident.
- Anyone born in New Zealand is eligible including New Zealanders no longer residing in New Zealand
- All nominations are valid for two years, 2009 nominations will be carried over for NZBIO 2010

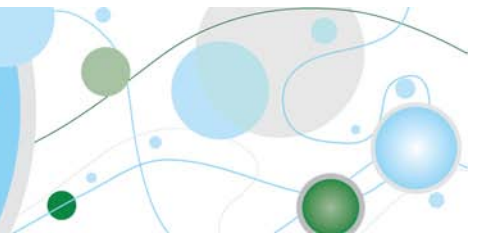
Nomination Procedure

- Nominations should be up to 2 pages in length, with supporting documentation attached.
- Format of the nomination is left to the nominator, but should highlight the nominee's contribution to society through biotechnology.
- Nominations for the award close on Friday 12, February 2010 at 5.00pm
- All nominations must be made by a financial (fully paid) NZBIO member in order to be valid.

Selection Criteria

- Award selection is competitive, based on merit.
- Benefit to society through biotechnology / life sciences / bio science is a major criterion.
- Commercial and academic efforts are given equal weighting.
- The candidate's entire career is considered.

The winner will be presented an award, and have the opportunity to address the audience should they wish. The award winner (or their nominee or a nominee appointed by the NZBIO Board) is entitled to have their travel and other expenses met to receive the award at the annual NZBIO conference.
